A hand - woven reed mat

A hand-woven reed mat is one product made in the Sakom Sub-district. Basketry practiced in daily life is a handicraft that depends largely on the skill of weaving together strips of selected materials. Countryside, tradition and belief, as well as available raw materials make up the different factors that determine the styles and shapes of basketry. Furthermore weaving skills truly represent a wisdom of the people that has been passed on from generation to generation. The skill is normally self taught nonetheless, basketry has gone through stages of development as time has gone by. Yet, the basic forms and patterns continue to be successful.

Such is the case with the village of Sakom, Tambon Sakom in the District of Chana in Songkhla Province, whose villages can barely remember when exactly they started weaving a jute called “Krajude” to make household utensils. According to the Farmer’s Housewives’ Development Group, the villagers began making reed mat products in this area when they came together as a group to set up the Sakom Farmer’s Housewives’ Development Group. They made reed mat weaving a living. There are many products that are made by housewives in the village such as handbags, belts, hats and small hold-alls.

Passage 3 (items 21 - 30)**Mak Kep**

Similar to jacks, Mak Kep is a traditional Thai game for children , the game is made up of five jackstones, or other small, circular objects, and is played by two or more players. Players draw lots to decide who goes first-a procedure called Khuen Ran, each player places all five jackstones on the back of their hand, tosses them into the air and tries to catch the stones in the palm of their hand. Whoever catches the most, gets to start first. To play Mak Kep, players throw four stones, trying to separate them from each other on the ground. The remaining stone is used as the starting stone, which is tossed up in the air while the player tries to pick up the other four stones, one at a time, while not forgetting to catch the starting stone. Failure to catch it, results in a foul and the next player takes their turn at Mak Kep. The next step follows a similar process, but two stones have to be picked up at each throw ; then three stones must be collected, especially the first and the fourth one. Finally, a player holds all four stones in their hand and throws up the starting stone while placing the four stones on the ground. He or she must try to collect all the stones in one movement and the scoring reflects the number of stones collected. A foul is awarded if no stones are collected and the player misses a turn. Mak Kep is known by different names in regions of the country, for instance it is called Mak Kep in the south, Mak Kep Mai, or Mai Kaeng Khis in the north, and Kep Met in Northeast of Thailand. Each region has its own variations on how to play this popular children's game, which helps young people to develop their reflexes.

Passage 4 (items 31 - 40)**Kite Flying**

Kite flying is one of the favourite sports amongst Thais of all ages and from all walks of life. Furthermore it is also considered a benefit to the nation as it mixes a wonderful blend of arts, culture, and sport. Kite flying can also be a competitive sporting event, as seen from battles between the star-shaped Chula kite, representing the male, and the diamond shaped Pakpao kite, representing the female. It is thought that the origins of kite flying began in China. Today, it is a popular sport enjoyed by people worldwide.

Kites are made simply from bamboo and Sa paper (*Broussonetia papyrifera*) which is made from the bark of the mulberry tree grown in northern Thailand. Those used in competitive events like Chula and Pakpao kites, are made from sisuk bamboo, which is tougher and more durable than other kinds of bamboo. Apart from Sa paper, kites are also made from Kaew paper (cellophane), which has a low price and is widely available.
