

<b>Thesis title</b>	A Study of the Implementation of the Project to Develop Police Stations to Serve the Public: Case Study of Amphur Muang Police Station, Songkhla Province
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### Abstract

This study of the implementation of the Project to Develop Police Stations to Serve the Public: Case Study of Amphur Muang Police Station, Songkhla Province, aimed to study the opinions of members of the police force and the people who made use of the police service in the Project regarding the implementation of the Project with reference to four areas: general administration and service, the rendering of criminal justice, the provision of safety of life and property, and the control and management of the traffic. The sample consisted of 205 members of the police force working under the Project and 182 people who made use of the service. The data - gathering instruments were two rating-scale-of-five questionnaires to be administered to the police and the people referred to. The statistics for the data analysis were percentage, mean, standard deviation, t-test, one-way ANOVA, and Scheffe pairwise-difference testing.

The research findings may be summarized as follows.

1. The members of the police force perceived the said target in all the four areas at a moderate level.
2. The people who were served perceived the said target in all the four areas at a moderate level.
3. The police officers differing in rank, gender, and income differed in their opinions on the operation with no statistical significance. The police officers differing in age and educational level differed in their opinions on the operations at the .05 level of statistical significance. The police officers differing in length of service differed in their opinions on the operations at the .01 level of statistical significance.
4. the people serviced who differed in gender, age, educational level, income, and occupation were different in their opinions on the operations without statistical significance.
